FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Court Reporting Services Under One Hour Effective January 1, 2014

	COURT REPORTING SERVICES UNDER ONE HOUR (Gov. Code 68086(a))				
Q:	What case types are eligible for this fee?	A:	This fee applies to Civil and Probate proceedings initiated by a party to the action.		
			Proceedings initiated by the Court, such as case management conferences, status reviews and compliance hearings are not eligible for this fee.		
Q:	Does this fee apply to short cause trials in Unlawful Detainer actions?	A:	No. This fee does not apply to parties requesting a short cause court trial in an Unlawful Detainer action.		
Q:	Does this fee apply to hearings on Civil Harassments?	A:	No. This fee does not apply to the initial hearing in a Civil Harassment action. If a motion is filed in the Civil Harassment case then the \$30.00 fee would be charged for the motion.		
Q:	Is the \$30.00 fee for court reporting services in proceedings lasting under one hour collected from one party or from all parties?	A:	Only one \$30.00 fee is collected for each case to cover all proceedings conducted within the same hour if the total time taken by those proceedings is one hour or less.		
Q:	When does the court collect the fee?	A:	The \$30.00 fee will be collected from the initiating party when moving papers are filed with the clerk.		
Q:	Who is responsible for paying the court reporter fee if there are multiple hearings/motions set to be heard at the same date and time?	A:	The initial party setting the matter for hearing shall be responsible for paying the court reporter fee.		
Q:	May the parties waive the services of a court reporter to be ineligible for the \$30.00 fee?	A:	No. The payment of the fee is not subject to the request of the party.		
Q:	Are public entities exempt from paying court reporter per diem fees?	A:	Yes.		

Q:	Is the fee refundable?	A:	The fee may be refunded if no court reporting services were provided due to unforeseen circumstances. If fees for court reporting services were paid in excess of \$30 for a proceeding lasting one hour or less, the excess may be refunded. The fee is not refundable if the matter is taken off calendar.
Q:	When will the fee be refunded if I'm eligible for a refund?	A:	The fee shall be refunded as soon as practicable, to the remitting party or parties.
Q:	May the Court waive the \$30.00 fee because of a party's financial condition?	A:	Yes. The court may (but is not required to) waive fees itemized in the Request To Waive Court Fees (FW-001).
Q:	Will additional fees be charged if the proceeding last more than one hour?	A:	Proceedings lasting more than one hour are subject to additional fees at the discretion of the Judicial Officer.
